LOCAL SHOOTS

Pack the bow, put the thermos of coffee in the center console, double check the route on the map, queue a podcast or playlist, and drop the truck in drive. Time to push off from shore and cruise to the next bow shoot. Along the way a friend may be picked up, a copilot, a fellow archery connoisseur. The topics discussed vary. Shoot format, gas prices, family matters, traffic, career developments, politics, and other subjects that stem from nervous and excited minds are dissected. Arrival at the venue and it's an exchange of greetings and handshakes with friends of old and new. Archers arch, conversations are had, a competition occurs and a memory is created. Equipment is packed up, handshakes, congratulations, exchanged salutations, the bow goes back in the truck, and the post shoot ice cream location is discussed with the copilot. The conversation towards home revolves from a post-game review of great shots, the one or two that got away, tweaks to be made to the setup, where to shoot the next weekend, what the work week involves, and silent reflection of self-performance. Not a bad way to spend a weekend, and prime for the week ahead.

Minnesota is blessed to have numerous clubs and ranges scattered across its diverse landscape that provide the platform for our favored sport of archery. Recently I was enraptured with the pure enjoyment and appreciation of life that only a weekend spent with friends traversing amongst the 10,000 lakes of our state with a bow in tow can provide. I am drawn to maps and navigation. I enjoy the preparation of examining routes, locations, and disposition of towns and geographical landmarks. Above the bow press in my shooting room in the basement I have a map of Minnesota, and I mark with a pin the locations I have shot at. I enjoy looking at the map and scanning the marks and recalling the shoots. The dates, the courses, the people I met there, the travel to get there, and the result of the shoot if I

remember. I identify spaces void of travel and begin the process of seeking road trip opportunities.

A couple weeks ago I went to two shoots. One was three hours south in southwest Minnesota and the other was three hours north in north central Minnesota. The same highway was taken to both shoots but the views from the driver seat were a stark contrast. The drive to the southwest was a glide across the prairie where the road was straddled by fields that this summer will yield crops of soybeans and corn. The skyline only broken by silos, shelter belts, water towers, and hog or cattle sheds. The straight highway only being caused to bend or drop by the occasional river bottom. The trek north the following morning was a meandering, curving, journey through swamps, hills of hardwood stands, and eventually coniferous trees that concealed bedded deer soaking in late February sunlight. The road was quiet as the sun rose that Sunday morning, except for the occasional turkey or deer that crossed, and eventually the church goes as they ventured out of the country towards the small, unincorporated towns frequenting the travel route. It was hard not to smile and be appreciative to live in a state with such variety and natural beauty.

The local shoots that awaited at the terminus of the journeys were unique but consistent with what occurs at ranges every weekend across the state. A display of a micro community of archers drawn together to participate in their sport at their club. Each location has its own culture and history constantly being shaped by its members. Members who during the week are nurses, farmers, doctors, carpenters, bankers, mechanics, county workers, or stay at home mothers. Members who are facing a variety family, career, financial, or health struggles. The commonality shared by all is the love for the bow and arrow and the



desire to be amongst archery people. They seek to share a line with people who are wanting to pull away from reality and focus on the next shot. To laugh and joke, swap stories, and make human connections with one another. They seek the pursuit of perfection and the personal humility that only archery can provide.

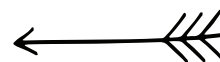
Local shoots showcase our state and the wonderful people who make up its communities. These events keep archery thriving. It allows for the beginning archer to make their next step in their immersion of the sport that enraptures people with the shooting of a single arrow. These shoots help provide a network of knowledge and support for that individual. It provides competition for those who cannot afford to travel beyond their surrounding counties, or those who need to work a weekend but can only get away to shoot an evening tournament. These events keep clubs active and strong which ripples out amongst the region and benefits surrounding clubs.

I encourage you to look at your map. Make a point to shoot at a new club or in a part of the state you have not been to. Relish the journey, the connections, the ever-changing portrait painted in the windshield. Dig deep in the conversations you have with the person in the seat besides you, whether it be a friend, stranger, spouse or child. If making a solo trek, dig even deeper with the conversation you have with yourself. Look around and savor the stories unfolding around us in the city and country communities

making up the framework of our society. Take a mental snapshot of the June morning steam rising from the Mississippi River as you cross over it near Rice on the morning of the State 900/50 Meter. Look for the spotted fawn triplets trailing their mother along the Cottonwood riverbanks as you hike the field course at Saratoga this July. Find reprieve in the late summer morning cool, while sending arrows downrange at first light on the 3D course in Bemidji. From Warroad to Worthington, Duluth to Dovray, Byron to Bemidji, Mankato to Moorhead, there is a memory to be made at full draw as we interweave ourselves into each other's road trip where the destination is happiness. Keep punching clocks and busting rocks!

FROM DULUTH TO VEGAS

Bayler Backowski competed in his first archery competition & on the national stage within one year's time

When Bayler Backowski's competitive archery career began, it went from 0 to 100 – FAST. In April 2025, at the age of 14, Bayler competed his first ever archery competition. He shot in the Youth Male Freestyle class at State Indoor, hosted by the Duluth Archery Club, taking home the 1st place prize. Since that spring day, Bayler has trekked across Minnesota and North Dakota to compete in archery competitions, continuously growing and learning more about the sport.

THE VEGAS SHOOT

Just 11 short months later, with a few more archery shoots under his belt, Bayler headed across the country to Las Vegas, Nevada to compete in The Vegas Shoot. Here, he competed against archers from across the country and world in the Compound Young Adult Male class. Shooting a 299 on Friday and a 300 on Saturday with a total of 43 X's, Bayler took home the gold medal and a \$1,000 scholarship. He also competed in a bonus scholarship shoot off open to all ages and classes under 18 – including champion level – and placed 2nd.

"My journey of target archery started just last year," Bayler said. "Competing in Las Vegas so soon is an unbelievable feeling. The coolest part of being at The Vegas Shoot for me was being able to talk with the top pros. They all are very nice people to talk to, everybody was."

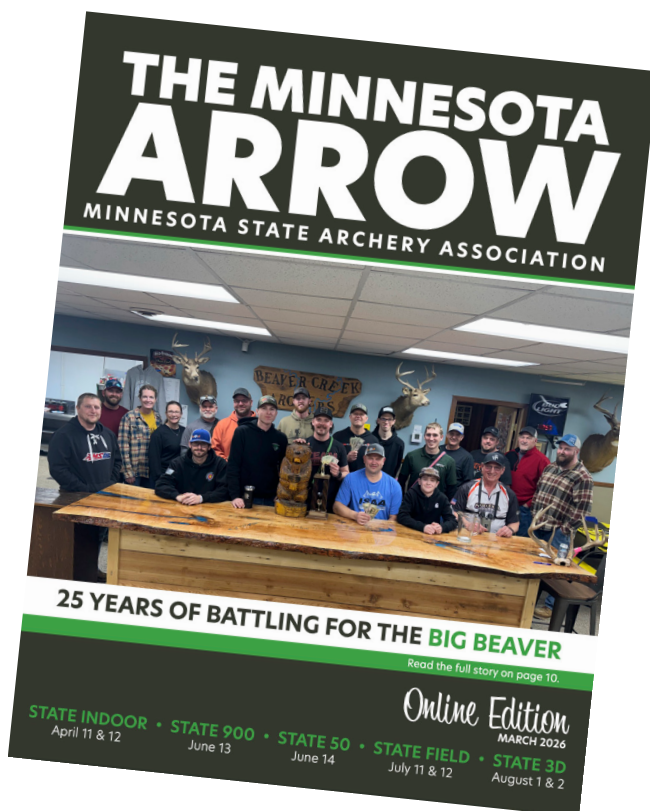

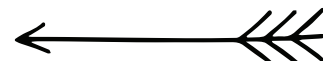

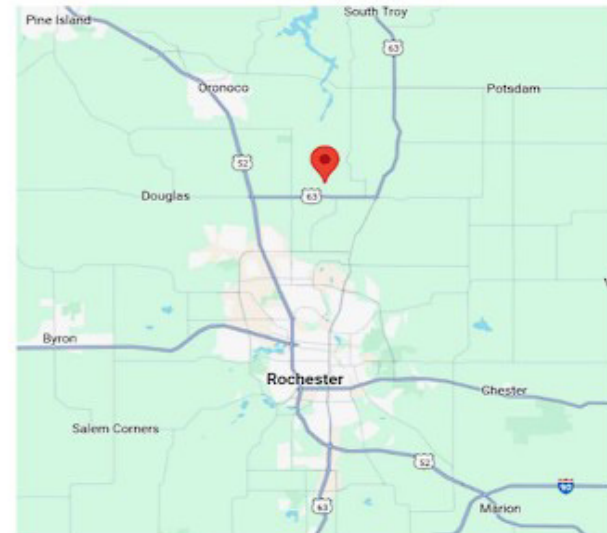

My wife and I were hiking around my grandparents' now-vacant farm in Embarrass, MN in mid October 2025. In one of the grassy fields, I saw some ravens on the ground. I took a few steps and realized they weren't ravens. And there were six of them. Forty miles from the Minnesota/Ontario border as the crow flies. (My cousin had trail cam pictures of them a couple years ago, but I had dismissed that evidence as not worth pursuing.)

On the following Thursday I was back at o'dark hundred with a deer cart loaded with my hunting pack, two popup blinds, a longbow, some sharp sticks and a couple of sorry looking, cheap decoys. I dropped the cart on a woods road a couple hundred yards from where I saw the birds on Tuesday. Looked for them in that field but saw nothing.

Went back to fetch the cart. As I was entering a smaller field on my way back to the Tuesday field, movement to my right caught my eye. They were coming off a pine ridge for their breakfast. I grabbed an arrow and stood with my bow at the field edge for thirty minutes as they fed out of bow range.

When they continued into the Tuesday field, I crossed the smaller field, set up a blind and brushed it in. I figured at the end of the day I might intercept them on their way back to their roosting location, About an hour after setting up and eating an early lunch, they came into view to my right. I hadn't even started calling. I thought it would take much longer for them to find their way back to their roosting location.

When they appeared, I was able to track them the whole time through my see-through blind and call them to my two decoys with my feeble calling skills. Once they made the turn toward me, I picked up my bow and got ready for what turned out to be a six yard shot. The bird's crop was stuffed full of bits of green vegetation.

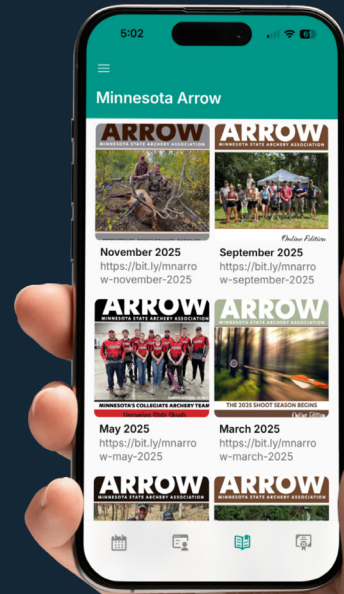

EARLY ARCHERY DAYS

My archery days began back in the early 1960's on our farm near Hoffman, MN. Bob Rhode was a neighbor to my father. This was before my time, but I found out in later years.

I was actually introduced to target archery when I visited Archery Center in Richfield, MN. There I met Al Muller. I purchased my White Wing target recurve in February 1968, from Al. My real obsession for competition archery began when I met Jim Ploen at the outdoor archery range at Lake Nokomis. The target butts were all full and he invited me to join him and shoot on his butt.

He suggested that if I wanted to be serious about competition archery, I should go to St. Paul and meet the people that belonged to the Toxophilites Archery Club. I did that the next week and that's where I also met the Hagemeyer twins, Ron Carlson, Sam and Gloria Fudenberg, Jim Harwood, Dick Mersh, LaVonne Hagemeyer and many other great people that were willing to include me and teach me. I had many wonderful experiences with this group of people.

One of my most memorable local tournaments was in St. Paul where I shot a 299 on a 300 Vegas with fingers. This was the highest score shot at this tournament.

MAJOR INFLUENCES

The late Wes Hagemeyer was the most influential person responsible for my success in archery. He spent countless hours talking to me and teaching me the basics of shooting a bow and arrow in the basement of his house.

The Toxophilites group of people were the most helpful and supportive people a young archer ever get to know and I never have forgotten the accidental meeting I had with Mr. Ploen that day at Nokomis.

BOW HUNTING

My bow hunting experiences began when I was a teenager in Alexandria, MN. Two of my high school teachers were into bowhunting and they inspired me and took me on my first excursion. My dad thought I was crazy when I spent \$35 on my first official hunting bow, a Bear Kodiak recurve from Bill Slipper of Osakis, MN.

Bow hunting has remained of major interest to me, having hunted such states as Minnesota, Michigan, Ohio, Alabama, North and South Dakota, Montana, Wyoming, Idaho, Colorado and Wisconsin. I have also hunted in Ontario, Canada. My hunting has been quite successful taking such animals as whitetail deer, mule deer, turkey, antelope, elk, black bear and moose. I currently have two animals registered in the Pope and Young record book (antelope and black bear).

- Discussion of raising shooting fees by \$5.00
- Todd will bring the trailer to the State Indoor to sell old bales, possibly the trailer (8'x20').
- Todd made the motion to take \$20,000 out of the investment fund and move it to a CD, Roger seconded, all ayes. Bruce Strom will use his best judgement with the bank to invest the money.

If there is a dispute in scoring that cannot be resolved during the allowed time then that, or those, participant(s) must contact the specified Target Tournament official within the allowed time and ask for a delay in submission. After the allowed time, and any additional time given by the specified Target Tournament official, the scorecard shall be ruled late and will be disqualified.
